

# MEET THE BOSS:

Crewe boss, Lee Bell, started his playing career by progressing through the ranks at Crewe. He also featured for numerous other football league clubs in an illustrous career, including Shrewsbury Town, Burton Albion, Mansfield Town and Macclesfield Town - however, the majority of appearances came for the Alex, featuring 128 times over 2 spells.

He was appointed Alex boss in November 2022, and has managed 32 games - winning 11 and drawing 9 - meaning a win percentage of 34.4%. He guided them away from relegation and to a 13th place standing, one which he will look to improve on this season.

# ONE TO WATCH THIS SEASON:

Charlie Finney, 19, is just one of the Youth players which the Alex fans should look out for this season.

Finney, a local Crewe boy, progressed through the ranks at the Mornflake Stadium before signing his first professional deal in 2021.

He went on loan to Chorley last season, and the midfielder has made 9 appearances for the Railwaymen in his career so far, and will look to make more in the 23-24 season.

I'm James, Vice-Chairman of the club and Commercial Manager, and I'll explain below the various sponsorship opportunities we have on offer for the 2023-24 season, with the First Team entering the NPL Division One West.

# WHY SPONSOR A NON-LEAGUE CLUB?

Having your business on an advertising board or on a teams shirt is much more than just that. Sport helps to deliver many life lessons for children of all ages and we can all learn things through these life lessons - discipline, respect, team work amongst other things.

There was an example in 2022 where one of our sponsors directly profited over 25,000 pounds on a job purely because they were on the shirts of one of our junior football teams, which proves that there is a lot of business that you can get from it.

In addition, every penny spent is classed as a Marketing Cost hence it is deductible against any profit you make for tax purposes - effectively, it reduces your profit against the tax part of a cost - it is a win-win for all involved.

# ANNUAL FOOTFALL

In 2021, over 250,000 people passed through our facilities - whether this be to utilise the incredible astroturf pitches, as over 50 youth



teams are linked to Vauxhall Motors FC across all leagues, both locally, regionally and nationally – from the Eastham District Mini Football League, the West Cheshire Youth League and the Junior Premier League, as well as our Main Arena with a team which plays in the Northern Premier First Division West.

Each sponsor gets recognition on our website and via Social Media, with over 7,000 followers across all platforms, with over 25,000 views on our YouTube channel in 2022 alone, as well as 10 million impressions on Twitter in the 2021–22 season, and tens of thousands of clicks on our website.

In this edition of 'The Academy', we spoke to VMFC U13 Cavaliers Manager, Mark Milward, about the progression of our U13 teams.

'From the U7s right through to the First Team, the club has outstanding teams and players and it continues to grow and move in the right direction.'



# **CLUB HISTORY**

# **FORMATION OF THE CLUB**

Vauxhall Motors FC were formed back in 1963, following the opening of the brand new Vauxhalls

Car Plant just across the other side of the motorway. The plant is still visible from the Rivacre

Road Pitch on the left hand side of the current main arena.

# EARLY HISTORY

The club initially played in the Ellesmere Port League and the Wirral Combination League, but

soon grew too strong for these leagues. We played at company-owned, Hooton Park, but moved to current home, Rivacre Park, in 1987 - opened by former England Manager, Bobby Robson. On the pitch, the club also found some success, winning our first West Cheshire League title in 1985. Motors first joined the North West Counties Football League in 1977, and won promotion from Division Two to Division One in our first season.



In the 1998-99 season, Motors achieved success, reaching the fifth round of the FA Vase, as well as winning the NWC Cup and achieving promotion to the



Northern Premier League. In the years after, the club achieved lots of success in the Northern Premier League, winning promotion to the NPL Premier Division in the first season in the division, before finishing second place in the NPL Prem. Motors also completed a historic FA Cup Run to the Second Round Proper in this time, beating Queens Park Rangers in the process. In 2004, boss Owen Brown led VMFC to promotion to the Conference North.

# MODERN MOTORS

being denied promotion
due to COVID. An

year's title sees us playing
